The Presidio Trust is an innovative federal agency created to save the Presidio and share it with the public. The Trust's Natural Resources department manages 145 acres of native plant communities in the park, including dune, coastal prairie, Oak woodland, and riparian habitats. Our ideal candidate is an individual who wants to learn basic restoration field practices and techniques that include identifying plants and wildlife common to the Presidio. Working closely with and being mentored by a Biological Science Technician, this internship includes participating in and leading field restoration activities, and assisting in all aspects of managing a volunteer program. If you want to support the management and stewardship of the Presidio's natural resources and restoration sites, this internship is for you.

Responsibilities

- Participate in and lead often repetitive field restoration activities such as:
 - o Removing invasive plants
 - o Planting native plants
 - Monitoring restoration progress
- Maintain and enter records of work performed into database
- Assist in inventorying and monitoring rare plants and wildlife
- Assist with all aspects of managing a volunteer program, including:
 - Planning and leading projects for volunteer workdays
 - o Preparing, setting-up, and cleaning up snacks and refreshments
 - Educating volunteers and visitors about local ecology and park issues
 - Maintaining the volunteer database and reporting on volunteer participation
- Maintain program tools, facilities, and equipment

- Love of the outdoors and curiosity about ecological restoration
- Desire to work with a diverse group of people with different backgrounds, ethnicities, genders, sexualities, ages, and viewpoints
- Willingness to write newsletter articles and take photos and videos
- Ability to work well within a team, as well as independently with minimal supervision
- Excited to take initiative
- Strong organizational skills
- Basic computer proficiency
- A positive attitude under difficult work conditions
- Must possess (at minimum) a valid Class C California Driver's License and be capable of driving
 in a busy urban park. This qualification is necessary in order to transport self, tools and other
 staff to and from work locations, shuttle volunteers to worksites, and use dump truck to haul
 debris.

The staff diligently manages native plant communities and wildlife, conducts natural resources research and monitoring, and continually challenges conventional thinking to create innovative solutions that improve the Park's ecological health. We work closely, share ideas with, other innovative leaders in ecology, and engage our local communities in community science, ecosystem restoration, and the enhancement of biodiversity within the park. In 2018, we planted over 20,000 seedlings, removed over 6,000 32-gallon bags of invasive species, and hosted over 9,000 volunteer hours restoring natural areas.
