The Contra Costa County Public Works Department is seeking qualified individuals to fill Vegetation Management Technician vacancies in the Maintenance Division. The Vegetation Management Technician may work in a variety of environments to include rural, riparian, suburb, and flood control areas but may be asked to assist with general services in spraying other County facilities. Our mission is to deliver cost effective, safe, reliable, sustainable projects, programs, quality services, as well as to provide support services that are competitive, attentive, responsive, efficient, safe, and high quality to our customers and other County Departments. We became the first County in California to be accredited by the American Public Works Association starting July 2001 and were re-accredited in 2004, 2008, 2012, and 2016. As an accredited agency, we strive on continuously improving. We review and improve work processes regularly and are currently being re-evaluated for accreditation on a four-year cycle.

TYPICAL TASKS:

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

License Required: Possession of a Valid California Motor Vehicle Operator's License. An out of state valid motor vehicle operator's license will be accepted during the application process.

Experience: Two (2) years of full-time or its equivalent experience in the eradication of noxious weeds and the management of vegetation.

Certificate: Must obtain and maintain a valid Qualified Applicator Certificate issued by the California

Department of Pesticide Regulation certifying the holder in categories A, B, C, D, F and G within nine (9) months of hire.

Desirable Qualifications

- Possession of a valid Agriculture Pest Control Advisor License in categories A, B, D, E and G
- Experience with landscape and related equipment (pesticide spray equipment, deck and push mowers, trimmers, chainsaws, etc.)
- Training and/or experience in landscape maintenance, greenhouses, etc.

Other Requirements: Employees in this class are subject to drug and alcohol testing under provisions of the County's Drug and Alcohol Testing Program.

SELECTION PROCESS:

- 1. **Application Filing:** All applicants must apply on-line at www.cccounty.us/hr and submit the information as indicated on the job announcement by the final filing date. A completed Supplemental Questionnaire is required at the time of applying.
- 2. **Application Evaluation:** Depending on the number of applications received, an Application Evaluation Board may be convened to evaluate and select the best-qualified candidates for invitation to the next phase of the examination.
- 3. **Multiple Choice Assessment:** multiple choice examination will be conducted to measures candidates' competencies as they relate to the job. These may include but are not limited to: attention to detail, professional and technical expertise, reading comprehension and safety focus (**Weighted 50%**)
- 4. Oral Interview: Candidates that achieve a passing score of 70% or higher on the multiple choice assessment will be invited to participate in an oral interview. The oral interview will measure candidates' competencies as they relate to the job. These may include, but are not limited to: Professional integrity and ethics, legal and regulatory navigation, delivering results and oral communication (Weighted 50%)

The Multiple Choice Exam is tentatively scheduled to take place via computer (remotely) the second week of November.

The Oral Interview is tentatively scheduled to take place the third week of November.

The Human Resources Department may change the examination steps noted above in accordance with the Personnel Management Regulations and accepted selection practices.

CONVICTION HISTORY

After you receive a conditional job offer, you will be fingerprinted, and your fingerprints will be sent to the California Department of Justice (DOJ) and the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). The resulting report of your conviction history (if any) will be used to determine whether the nature of your conviction conflicts with the specific duties and responsibilities of the job for which you have received a conditional job offer. If a conflict exists, you will be asked to present any evidence of rehabilitation that may mitigate the conflict, except when federal or state regulations bar employment in specific circumstances. Having a conviction history does not automatically preclude you from a job with Contra Costa County. If you accept a conditional job offer, the Human Resources department will contact you to schedule a fingerprinting appointment.

DISASTER SERVICE WORKER

Employees are required to complete all Disaster Service Worker-related training as assigned, and to return to work as ordered in the event of an emergency.
