#### STRENGTH TO STRENGTH IN TRAIL-O

MDOC members are continuing their success in Trail-O competitions on a national and international level.

Ben Kyd (M20) won Day 1 at the JK23 Trail O competition, where he was top junior in 2 of 3 competitions, and jointly top with Dom Wathey (M18) in the other. Ben was also top junior at the British Trail-O Championships. Sam Drinkwater (M21), River Edis-Smith (M21) and John Kewley (M60) also put in strong performances. Both John and Ben subsequently represented GB at the European Championships, where John achieved a GB best in 10th place. And at the World Trail-O Champs (WTOC) in the Czech Republic, Ben was the highest-ranking Brit ever in the Temp-O, in 16th place. Both Ben and John were in the 3<sup>rd</sup> placed GB relay team. Online, MDOC is currently in the lead for TempO after two 2nd place results in that discipline.

Recent new member Wang Ki Yuen (M21) also comes with a strong track record in Trail O with his previous club so all in all the team is in a strong position for more success in 2024.
