2. The Community Mental Health Liaison (CMHL) of the Year Award is for a Liaison who has demonstrated exceptional involvement, dedication and/or support of the development of CIT and its sustainment. They have provided excellent service to Law Enforcement in coordinating services for persons with mental health concerns.
3. The CIT Champion of the Year Award is for an individual or group who has demonstrated exceptional involvement, dedication and/ or support of the development of CIT and its sustainment. This can include a mental health professional or advocate, a person with lived experience, or a mental health agency or community organization who works closely with CIT.
